





Masterclass with prof. dr. Regina Grafe, Thursday March 26 2015, Leiden

Call for Papers

The Institute for History of Leiden University, in collaboration with the N.W. Posthumus Institute and the Amsterdam School for Culture and History of the University of Amsterdam, organises a Masterclass by prof. dr. Regina Grafe (European University Institute) on **Thursday 26 March 2015**.

Prof. Grafe is professor of early modern history of Europe, with a special interest in political economy. She has published extensively about the place of the Hispanic empire in the Atlantic world, from the perspective of institutions and markets. Her expertise also comprises, but is not limited to, the comparative history of private and public commercial institutions and legal norms.

The masterclass offers (Research-) Master students, PhD Candidates and early post-docs the opportunity to present their paper to Prof. Grafe. In particular, we welcome papers in the following fields: influencing market regulations and the mechanisms of lobbying, brokerage, networks and private-order institutions in early-modern European states.

Before **16 January 2015** paper proposals consisting of a 250 words abstract can be sent to j.j.s.van.den.tol@hum.leidenuniv.nl. A full paper should be submitted by **27 February** to provide prof. Grafe with sufficient time to examine the papers.
